The 263rd AAMDC is a South Carolina National Guard unit that provides command and control of Army air defense units and plans, integrates and executes Army air defense activities for joint air operations in the U.S. Northern Command (NORTHCOM) area of responsibility. When designated, the commander serves as a deputy area air defense commander for defensive counter air operations for both air and missile threats. MG Rice will provide an overview of the 263rd AAMDC mission in NORTHCOM and beyond.
