May is known as the month of mental health in the military. As the Family Life Chaplain on Fort Eisenhower (Gordon), it is every month for me. I provide professional counseling to many couples and individuals, active duty and retirees. Everyone's military experience is unique in how it affects them and their family and loved ones. Even years after exiting service, problems can arise connected to their time in service. The worst choices veterans can make are to either isolate themselves or turn to self-destructive behaviors.

There is help. The VA offers professional counselors. Churches sometimes have trained pastoral counselors. I myself am not only an ordained minister but also a fully licensed Marriage and Family Therapist and Army Chaplain. I currently provide free, confidential counseling to Vietnam Veterans, Gulf War Veterans, and Veterans of more recent conflicts. I also am one of the Chaplains for a FREE weeklong program for Veterans called Warfighter Advance.
